1992 Château Pichon Lalande, Pauillac.....\$29.95

We sold over 150 cases of this wine when it was released in 1995—at about this same price. I first tasted this wine out of barrel on April 6, 1993. I wrote that the aroma was spicy and the wine had good concentration on the palate for a '92 Bordeaux. Try it now, and you won't be disappointed. A mere \$80 less than the 1996 vintage. —Clyde Beffa

1993 Château Pichon Baron, Pauillac\$29.95

I had this wine at the Château last year and was really impressed. I again tasted it last month at a restaurant. Well, we were just offered 100 cases at a great price and here it is. A super buy. See Ralph's notes on page 6.

1997 Château Cos d'Estournel, St-Estèphe\$34.99

Half price special! One of the best of the vintage and a great one to cellar for 5-10 years.

1997 Château Poujeaux, Moulis.....\$19.95

Save the 1996 and drink this beauty now. Pain Grille aromas and ripe, fruity flavors. Fine balance and round tannins. Mouthwatering good.

1997 Château Smith-Haut-Lafitte, Graves\$29.95

This wine is elegant and refined with mineral aromas meshed with toasty oak. Smooth on the palate—it begs to be drunk now. Another one of those fine "off vintage" Bordeaux finds.

Special Offering: NV8 Cain Cuvée

NV8, Cain Cuvee\$21.99

The NV8 is a blend not only of varieties, but also of vintages. While in any vintage a winery is allowed to add up to 5% of a different year into its blend, this year Cain was not going to be held to this rule. Not with all of the delicious 1997 still waiting to be bottled. The small crop of 1998 provided elegant, aromatic, silky and perfumed wines, while the large crop of 1997 provided Cain with sweet, rich wines with lots of concentration. Together they create the "NV8". The final blend turned out to be 76% Cabernet Franc, 7% Merlot and 17% Cabernet Franc; of which 83% was 1998 fruit and 17% was 1997 fruit. "WOW! I could have had an NV8"

Your Easter Bubbly

Billecart-Salmon Brut Reserve "K&L Cuvée" (750ml)\$29.99

This cuvée is rich, toasty, and creamy on the palate with a long, lingering finish and fine bead. We think it's the best value bubbly on the market today. Jim Barr's expert tasting group rated it first, ahead of some big name (and big price) Champagnes. **Special case purchase price is \$300 (\$25. per bottle).**

1995 Billecart-Salmon "Cuvée Nicolas-François" Brut\$54.95

Outstanding cuvée, rich, round, and tasty while maintaining fine delicacy. Perfectly balanced. It will cellar well for several years. **Special case price \$600.**

P.S. Folks are still buzzing about one of last month's Signature wines—the 1993 Château Gruaud Larose for under \$25!

Volare . . . When you read this article, I will be in beautiful Italia with Greg and Jeff, trying all the great wines to come from 1997, '98, and '99. You can get up-to-date tasting notes and watch our progress on our Website, www.klwines.com. Here are a few Italian gems that you can enjoy while downloading the notes.

1998 Peter Dipoli Yugum (\$33.95) Peter Dipoli is the master of the Bordeaux varietal in the Alto Adige. From his lyrical Sauvignon, Voglar, to this tremendous red, his wines are some of the top wines of the region. Made from a blend of 45% Merlot and 65% Cabernet Sauvignon, the Yugum reminds me of classic Médoc, with red full of ripe fruit and great focus and style. Cellar for 5-7 years.

1994 Quintarelli, Rosso del Bepi (\$69.95) Our California debut of the great Amarone maestro's Rosso. This super Veronese is made from a combination of grapes from his Ca Paletta vineyard and his *passito*-style Cabernet Franc. The result is a rich red full of aromas of dried currants and cassis and plenty of ripe fruit on the palate. Enjoy with roast loin of venison in a currant and juniper sauce.

1996 Querciabella Camartina (\$49.99) The *Gambero Rosso* calls Querciabella "the best winery in Greve." Who am I to argue? The latest offering of Ca Martina is the ultimate testament of quality.

A "super Tuscan" blend of 80% Sangiovese Grosso with equal parts of Cabernet Sauvignon and Cabernet Franc, this red shows the great structure of wines from Greve, with generous fruit and a stylish finish. Try this red in 5-10 years.

It was quite a revelation to visit the Badia last year with Greg. All their hard work has reaped rewards with the following Tuscan reds. The **1997 Badia di Morrona "N'antia" (\$24.99)**, a blend of 40% Sangiovese, 40% Cabernet Sauvignon, and 20% Merlot, was tremendous out of barrel and better when it arrived, full of black cherry fruit and hints of oak. 91 points from the *Wine Spectator* (October 31, 2000). The **1997 Badia di Morrona "Vigna Alta" (\$29.95)** is a tremendous old vine Sangiovese, full of aromas of ripe cherry, earth, and spice. The Alta will blossom beautifully over the next 5-10 years. Try it with a Tuscan classic—roast pork, sautéed spinach and cannellini beans.

Kerri's Excellent Trip

I never imagined I would have the opportunity to travel to South Africa. Not knowing what to expect, I was surprised to see the beautiful wine estates, to experience the warmth of the South African people, and most importantly, to taste the quality of the wine. Was it worth the 19+ hours it took to get there? Absolutely! The following are a few of the stand-outs from the trip.

Waterford is a joint venture of Jeremy Ord and winemaker Kevin Arnold. The newly-built Cape-Mediterranean Winery is quite impressive. The actual winery is built around a courtyard featuring the Waterford symbol of a double-tiered fountain. The **1999 Kevin Arnold Shiraz (\$25.99)** bears the name "Lloyd Francis" after one of Arnold's sons. The wine is youthful, rich, and soft with ripe tannins and stacks of dark fruit. Very rich and concentrated, this wine will continue to develop over the years. Stephen Tanzer, in his *International Wine Cellar Journal* rated it 91 points and calls it "among the most persistent wines tasted this year from South Africa." Very different from the Waterford Estate is the production of Le Riche wines. Etienne Le Riche had been the winemaker at Rustenberg for over twenty years when he decided to branch out on his own in 1997. His philosophy is "Thank God wines are not made by machine, but by nature in the vineyard." He works with one assistant, and the annual production is about 5,000 cases a year. The **1999 Le Riche Merlot-Cabernet Sauvignon (\$16.95)** is 60% Merlot and 40% Cabernet. Toasty oak with ripe plum and cherry fruit. Good acid balance and a fine finish. Finally, the **1999 Slaley Reserve Shiraz (Inquire)** is filled with smoky, toasty aromas. Very spicy and concentrated on the palate. It's a fabulous, full-bodied wine. Just want to say thank you to the people at Southern Starz for such an amazing experience. —*Kerri Beffa*

elegance in its dark, jammy, ripe fruit flavors touched with oak.

Incredible, lush fruit, structure, and complexity. Outstanding value. Similar to its St-Emilion neighbors that sell at twice the price.

1998 Croix de Rambeau, St-Emilion ..\$14.95

Merlot lushness, good concentration of flavor.

1998 Gulliver, Bordeaux.....\$9.99

Made by Léoville-Poyferré. Best value everyday drinking. 70% Merlot, 30% Cabernet, produced in the Entre-Deux-Mers region. It has the same deep toasty, blackberry, earth, and oak features as its mothership.

1998 Lamothe-Bergeron, Médoc.....\$12.95

Located in the village of Cussac, north of Arnaud between Margaux and St-Julien, this vineyard lies low to the river, has a heavy clay soil and lots of surrounding forest. Lamothe is big, bold and a little rustic. A serious mouthful of wine.

1998 l'Annonciation, St-Emilion\$13.95

Lush, fruity, and forward. Toasty oak.

1998 Magdelaine, St-Emilion\$79.95

91 points by the raters. One for the cellar. Layers of black fruit flavors.

1998 Pressac, St-Emilion\$15.95

Don't miss this value. Pain Grille aromas and ripe fruity flavors.

1998 Segonzac VV, Médoc\$12.99

This wine is from the Côte de Blaye, located directly across the Gironde estuary from the commune of Marguax. Its vineyards were planted 100 years before those of the Médoc.

1998 Thieuley Reserve,

Entre-deux Mers\$16.95

Very dark and concentrated. It could use a few years in the cellar or, if you drink it young, how about a couple hours in the decanter.

1998 Verdigan, Médoc\$18.95

Very attractive, bright wine with lots of red berry fruit. Very well balanced

1998 Vieux Robin VV, Médoc\$17.95

Old vines contribute richness and power to this wine. Superb value for the cellar.

Garvey Cream Sherry\$7.99

Garvey "San Patricio" Fino Sherry\$10.99

Two excellent value, everyday drinking Sherries. The San Patricio exhibits a very dry nuttiness and goes great with a cream of Leek soup.

Hidalgo Fino Sherry, the El Cuadrado.....\$17.99

This single vineyard fino is as vivid as a white wine can be—clean, concentrated, completely dry, refreshing, and long.

Hidalgo Cortado, Palo Cortado \$18.99

1972 Albala Don PX Gran Reserva (375 ml)\$19.99

For those last few cold days of the year, mature wine made from the Pedro Ximenez grape is incomparable as a nightcap. Black, thick, sweet, and warming.

Pata de Gallina Oloroso, Lustau \$21.99

This wine is made from 100% Palomino and is dry but full of walnut richness with a finish that one encounters only in \$100+ bottles of wine! I have enjoyed this many times with deep fried almonds in front of a crackling fire.

Exciting Times in Bordeaux—Off-Vintages and a Few Thoughts

By the time you read this column the King of the Médoc, Mr Clyde Beffa, Jr and I will be in the cellars of the great Bordeaux châteaux tasting and evaluating a few hundred of the much anticipated 2000 vintage. We will give you a full report when we return. This is much tougher work than it seems. Physical conditioning is a must. So I'm working out—drinking more old Bordeaux—to get ready for this trip. Many of the wines I've been drinking come from so-called "off-vintages." Two such wines are from San Francisco's summer of love vintage, 1967. The striking Châteaux Haut-Bailly and Haut-Brion are in perfect condition for their age and absolutely delicious. Because of an overabundance of heat and then rain, 1967 was an off-vintage beset with problems. These wines are exceptionally balanced, though, and the terrior comes shining through, holding the wines together. Last week in our tasting bar we poured from another off-vintage—**1997 Dame de Montrose (\$19.95)**, a second wine. Our customers tasted this wonderful wine and went right over to the rack to buy it.

These Bordeaux estates strive to make great wines every year, but Mother Nature doesn't always cooperate. That's when the experience and commitment of Bordeaux winemakers really kicks in: the soil, the severe selection of fruit on the sorting tables, declassification, or throwing out of a major percentage of the harvest (60–70% in some years) ensure excellent wines.

As he is known to do, cagey veteran wine merchant Clyde has made some shrewd purchases of off-vintage wines that I think you'll love. **1993 Château Pichon-Longueville-Baron (\$29.95)** is a wine that benefits from the ultra modern winemaking facility of the producer. Full of ripe, medium-bodied Cabernet fruit with a smoky-toasty-leathery quality, this wine is super clean and well balanced. I had it with sea bass at the fine Chantilly restaurant next-door and it was lovely—and what a value! **1992 Château Pichon-Longueville-Comtesse de Lalande (\$29.95)** made a tasty wine in this "off vintage." Aged in 50% new oak barrels, this delightful wine has that telltale Pichon-cedar nose with spicy undertones. It's round and soft on the palate with good balancing acidity and fine length. A joy to drink right now and,

again, it's at a bargain price. A few years ago I sold my good customer John Martini the 1993 and he called me back to say he didn't think it was very good. I told him to be patient, to let the wine settle and it would be a nice drink. Well, he called me this week and said "I guess you can throw the rating and vintage reports out the window. This wine tastes great after the kids have gone to bed." The same thing can be said for **1997 Château Poujeaux (\$19.99)**. We've sold a ton of the fine 1996 vintage, but this 1997 is the better drink today. I had the 1970 recently and it was great. Poujeaux fans get on this ASAP!

Moving back to the great vintages; there is no doubt that the **Smith-Haut-Lafitte** property owned by the Cathiard family is making stunning wine. We tasted the fine and powerful **1998 Rouge** at the Les Cinq dinner this week and it showed all the qualities of a great wine. Deep, dark purple, grapy fruit with the right amount of new oak, it's a classic, long aging wine that will carry this estate's reputation for many years. When we visited S-H-L in September on my golf and wine tour, my customers tasted the **1998 Blanc** and went crazy for it! I was sold out of the wine at the time, so my customers bought it on the spot and carried cases of this coveted blanc home! It's a classic, rich, powerful, creamy, earthy white wine from the Graves, that will develop for years. We are due to receive some in shortly. This September 2-9, the tour will be staying at Les Sources de Caudalie located in the Smith-Haut-Lafitte vineyards during my "Taste the Greats of Bordeaux Tour. It was quite a scene at our tasting bar last week when we poured some tasty 1998 Bordeaux values. Now these wines are not famous, but customers don't lie: we had to keep stocking the shelves all day long. If you're interested, they were **Château Pressac (\$15.95)**; **L'Annonciation (\$13.95)**; **Château Thieuley Reserve (\$16.95)**—all contain a very high percentage of the very successful Merlot fruit from the right bank in 1998, and they are great values!

Trey's Top Picks!

Spring is finally here! That means it's also time to taste what the world has to offer for the long awaited 2000 vintage. Early reports are very positive from Bordeaux and Oregon, while first impressions from California and Burgundy seem to be mixed. In Italy, the current vintage is always better than the previous, so I'm assuming it will be outstanding! I am sure Greg and Jeff can fill you in on all the details (though Jeff may have lost his US citizenship after back-to-back trips to Germany and Italy). By the end of April, the K&L staff will be well informed on the outlook of the 2000 vintage and the progress of the 1999 vintage. Back on the home front it's time for a new release! The long awaited **1998 Justin Isosceles (\$39.99)**. Very concentrated and deep for a 1998, the Isosceles is a blend of 65% Cabernet Sauvignon, 19% Cabernet Franc, and 16% Merlot. Elegant in the mouth, with layers of dark, spicy fruits, toasted oak and soft, silky tannins, it will make excellent drinking over the next 5-7 years. The first of the 1999 California Zinfandels and 1999 Oregon Pinots has arrived. The 1999 vintage in Oregon has been described as excellent! Like 1998s, the wines are ripe and full with a good deal of concentration and depth. The 1999s are a bit more forward than the '98s in general, but certainly do not lack intensity. Newly arrived wines include the **1999 Bethel Heights "Freedom Hill" Pinot Noir (\$32.99)**, **1999 Chehalem "3 Vineyards" Pinot Noir (\$22.99)**, and the **1999 Willakenzie Estate Pinot Noir (\$20.99)**. Speaking of Willakenzie, I have to mention a wine that was a huge hit at one of our recent staff tastings, the **1999 Willakenzie Estate Willamette Valley Pinot Blanc (\$13.99)**. The wine was deep and rich with a creamy texture, great acidity, and flavors of fresh butterscotch and spice. March also saw the release of two of our favorite wines year in and year out, the **2000 Mason Sauvignon Blanc (\$12.99)** and the **1998 Mason Merlot (\$19.99)**. The Sauvignon Blanc is as creamy, fresh and as clean as ever, and the Merlot is soft and round with lots of dark fruits and a touch of oak. —Trey Beffa

Brian's Spring Fling Best Bets

Five wines you can thaw out with a friend(s) or by your lonesome. (Advice: start earlier to ensure finishing the bottles.)

1998 Handley Dry Creek Chardonnay (\$13.99) A '98 that's truly great—not overly expensive or overly done. This wine is true to the beautiful Sonoma County it hails from, with lots of vanilla fruit and a light spice. The French oak finish is delish.

1998 Olivet Lane Russian River Chardonnay (\$13.99)

1998 Olivet Lane Russian River Pinot Noir (\$18.99) Contrary to popular belief these wines are not from Russia. Both have been extremely important in the ebb and flow of K&L inventory because they are always sensational. The Chardonnay is a mouthful of rich fruit lightly oaked; the Pinot was terrific with Sherry's rosemary pork roast. Decanting really lengthens the finish.

1997 Estate Baccala Napa Merlot (\$12.99) This wine is nice and soft with just enough cherry fruit to go with anything. A step up from the mass-produced reds you find at the 7-11, for cryin' out loud!

1996 Voilà Napa Valley Cabernet Sauvignon (\$19.98) Our folks up in SF have long touted this winery as sneaky spectacular. They had a "Mélange" that was as good as that word sounds. This Cab was decanted and opened up very nicely. I actually served this blind (and decanted) to a Silver Oak lover and he thought I had busted open a 1994 Napa! Great oak edge without being fakey-finished. You gotta give this one a look-see. And to all a good month—*Brian Keating*

Old Friends, New Friends . . .

The welcome return of Mayacamas to K&L gave us cause to smile. The **1997 Mayacamas Chardonnay (\$29.99)** is a great example of wonderfully expressive "old style" pure Chard fruit, combining classy structure and great acidity from careful estate winemaking, and no induced malolactic. I heard the words "French style" several times in our tasting: this is a nicely balanced food wine. Don't miss the return of this venerable friend of the wine world.

The **1999 Storrs "Meyley Vineyard" Chardonnay (\$22.99)** represents a newer style of Chard. 100% barrel fermented, rich and full of ripe red apple fruit, buttery oak, and butterscotch. A crowd pleaser, this is a fantastic single vineyard Chard from the Santa Cruz Mountains, a real California gem from high in the redwoods.

The **1998 Tantara "Bien Nacido" Pinot Noir (\$32.99)** is a new and seductive wine from Santa Barbara. Fruit from old vines are used to make this brambly, spicy, vivacious Pinot, showing intense, full, and bold black cherry that is quite long and lingering on the finish, I admit to putting the cork back in and taking this one home!

From Bill and Joan Smith (of La Jota fame) come two fabulous Pinots from the Sonoma Coast. The **1999 WH Smith Sonoma Coast Pinot (\$14.99)** is quite a charmer with elegant, bright cherries and a lovely feel in the mouth, a light touch of French oak and a graceful style. This wine has achieved the difficult balance of being delicate but not wimpy. A bigger wine, the **1999 WH Smith "Hellenthal" Pinot (\$32.99)**, is a more intense example of Pinot. Low yields from this vineyard produce a spicy, complex wine, full in the mouth with great balance and extracted dark berry/cherry fruit that should age beautifully for 2-3 years. Classy!

I can't finish without letting you know about our newest Kalinda, the **2000 Kalinda Sauvignon Blanc (\$9.99)**. Always a favorite, this is our best yet! A beautiful nose (think New Zealand) and a forward palate of melon leading into crisp citrus acidity . . . absolutely mouthwatering! —*Shaun Green*

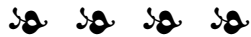

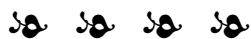

Opening scene: Julie Andrews as Mourvedre, spinning wildly on a hill-top in a modest St Paulie girl outfit, yodeling our title track:

*The hills are alive with the smell of Barrsick.
The wine he has made has been dead for years.
To the hills I will run from the Jim of Barrsick
The wine that he makes has me switching to beers.
I say not a word to the Jim of Barrsick.
but I know I will hear what I've heard before
A lot of merde from the Jim of Barrsick.
With this plug in my nose, I can sing no more . . .*

O.K, scene two, and we'll have to do this quick. The DonTrump family (cute yet bratty kids, lederhosen, etc) is trying to keep three fabulous Bordeaux wines from the Germans. We might as well have a song about a wine, hmmm?

Mourvedre: *Wine prices dropping just seems like a fiction,
If I say Bor-dox I'm weak with my diction,
Montrose and Barton and Cos to the nines,
These are a few of my favorite wines!
Montrose is plumper, roasted and classy,
Cos more restrained, crisper, not brassy,
Barton is opulent and has all the signs,
These are a few of my favorite wines!
When the Barr flies, and the price stings,
You can still be glad
To simply remember these favorite wines
with prices that aren't . . . so bad!*

More about the wines later. Back to the story: Mourvedre leaves the convent, goes to the DonTrump residence and charms the beejesus out of the bratty kids, teaching them a song that the nuns sang about her back at the convent. And guess what? It goes like this:

*How do you solve a problem like Mourvedre?
How do you drink a wine from Jimmy Barr?
How do you find a word for "this is awful?"
Crappity crap, 50 strokes from par.*

*Many a wine you'd like in lieu of this one
Many a wine should never have this smell.
How can he make a drink
with such an awful stink
It makes you feel you've died and gone to Hell . . .*

O.K., that tune has definitely run its course. So: Mourvedre and the kids must flee the evil army with their cache of **1983 Montrose** (honest, it showed a lot of warmth and ripe, fleshy character); the **1981 Cos d'Estournel** (the Claret lovers' Claret, lovely balance), and the **1988 Léoville-Barton** (forward and plummy, with tannins that are melting away), and Captain Don Trump is trying to help them get away. But Herr Jim Barrsick has discovered their plan and will attempt to pour his nasty wine down their oh-so-delicate gullets. They are captured and led to a dark and stormy cell. It is here that Mourvedre perfects the Flamenco guitar and lays the groundwork for her second incarnation, when she puts on, er, some weight and becomes known as Charo. But first, an almost pointless song:

Mourvedre: *Dough, you need, in great supply,
Buy, to buy a drop of wine.
Me, I'll stick with three Bordeaux.
Old, 'cause new is out of line.
So, a needle in your eye
If you drink the wine of Barr.
Cos, with Montrose and Barton—
they'll make your dough go far far, far, far . . .*

While Mourvedre and the kids are locked up, two things happen: she teaches them how to fly about the room whilst holding an umbrella and singing about medicine, and Captain Don Trump almost gets married! But statutory laws being what they are, he calls it quits when his fiancée says: *I am 13 going on 14, I'll bet that that's a shock.
It's a disgrace, and saving your face
might save your head from the block.
I am 13 going on 14, almost your teenage wife.
You'll go to jail, you silly old male,
and ruin your worthless life . . ."*

Like I said, he doesn't go through with it, but marries Mourvedre instead and lives happily ever after. I mean, even after drinking some of Barr's wine by mistake. So long. Farewell. —Joe Zugelder

Jim's Hare-raising April Gems

As you read this, Clyde, Trey, Shaun, Ralph, Greg, Jeff are traipsing around France and Italy on a tasting and buying spree with the sole purpose of continuing to discover great buys for our customers. The 1998 Rhône Valley vintage produced some monumentally great wines and you must not miss them, even the simplest Côtes-du-Rhône. Likewise, that vintage was followed by an equally exceptional harvest in 1999. The prices will be very reasonable, so as they arrive, buy a bottle or two and find out for yourself, then stock up.

The **1998 Côtes-du-Ventoux, Reserve du Vigneron, Cave Beaumont (\$7.99)** is medium-deep ruby in color and offers distinctive aromatics of black cherry and white pepper spiciness, which carry through on the medium-full, balanced, soft palate impression. A wine for the near-term that can be enjoyed with fish or a pork tenderloin. (🍷🍷🍷🍷) Similar to the above, but with a bit more flashy fruit comes this excellent

little gem (from C Chassagne) **1999 Vin de Pays de Vaucluse, Les Amandiers (\$5.99)**. Medium full in body with soft user-friendly tannins and a subtle complexity, this pretty little Rhône is imminently drinkable, with a bright, mouthwatering finish. (🍷🍷🍷🍷)

1999 Gigondas, Domaine Cécile Chassagne (\$14.95) is classic old style Gigondas at its very best. Deeply colored, the nose explodes with gamy, peppery qualities, while in the mouth you will be treated to an incredibly rich, lush style that is complex and full, yet possessing soft, round tannins, with a long, silky/sexy finish. This is one that you will be able to age for another five to ten years. (🍷🍷🍷🍷 🍷🍷)

1999 Côtes-du-Rhône, Domaine de Verquière (\$7.99) will be my everyday house red for the month of April. It is balanced and proportional, offers tons of ripe plum-like to cherry-like fruit, has excellent grip and firmness, yet is very soft round, and has a long, medium full finish. Try this lovely wine with wild game... enjoy. (🍷🍷🍷🍷🍷🍷)

The Joanny won a gold medal at Macon. 30% Syrah and 55% Grenache with a little Carignane and Mourvedre thrown in for good measure. Spicy and lively with blackberry overtones. Superb value.

1998 Valreas, R Bouchard (\$9.99) Hooray! It's back! One of our most popular red wines, the '98 Bouchard is their best offering yet. Valreas was one of the original Côtes du Rhône villages, and it became its own AC in 1993. It is full of ripe raspberry and blackberry fruit with hints of clove and white pepper spice. Try this Rhône red with gigot d'agneau, ratatouille, and haricots vert!

1999 Lirac Reserve, Segues (\$11.99) Just across the river from Châteauneuf-du-Pape, this Lirac is a much different red than its neighbor. Light and fruity, this wine offers plenty of ripe, vibrant raspberry and plum fruit with some earth and peppery spice. Soft tannins make this easy drinker a pleasure on the palate and a bargain for the pocketbook.

1998 Domaine Chiroulet “Classique,” Côtes du Gascogne (\$9.99) From the Côtes du Gascogne, a flashy new-wave wine at this price? You bet! The cuvee is 50% Merlot, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon, 20% Cabernet Franc and 10% Tannant. From the heady aromas, toasty nuances blend with lush, ripe plum and cherry fruit with accents of mocha. There are balanced moderate tannins with fine length. A super value!

1998 Beaume de Venise “Terroir du Trias” (\$12.99) One of those gems that we discovered on our last trip to Europe. Nestled in the shadow of the limestone-rich mountain range known as the Dentelles de Montmirail is the source of this beauty. Trias is a vineyard further up the slope, and its wines have more power and structure than one might expect from a Beaume de Venise. A blend of 95% Grenache and 5% Syrah, this wine has ripe, jammy boysenberry fruit with a hint of roasted grains and minerals. Well-balanced with a very fine finish.

He's back . . . the rascal from Rasteau, Andre Romero. Mr Parker calls him the superstar of Rasteau, and with good reason! If you are unfamiliar with the wine from Domaine Soumade, don't miss your chance to try them from the exceptional 1998 vintage.

1998 Rasteau “Confiance” (\$19.99) More density with mineral notes, black pepper, dark berry and licorice accents. An exceptional finish. Super!

1995 Vin Doux (\$19.95 500ml) Try this wonderful dessert wine instead of Port for your next dinner party. 100% Grenache, rich with malty, ripe blackberry notes. Moderate tannins and very good length.

Pour Votre Plaisir

We are just returning from our tasting tour in France, but not in time for any reports on the vintage this month, so stay tuned.

Of course, we continue to scout for some of the best values around in delicious Burgundy. As I mentioned last month, the Cote Chalonnaise continues to produce some delightful wines and great values. The 1998 Mercurey, Château de Mercey (\$14.99) has a deep dark plum hue, with sweet fruit on the nose. This is a big wine, with nice fruit, firm tannins and pretty black plum notes on the palate. What a bargain, from the winemaking team at Antonin Rodet.

Newly back in stock is the 1998 Monthelie, Domaine Jean Garaudet (\$19.99), with a pretty cherry note in the nose and ripe, round and fruity flavors on the palate. This is attractive, rich and affordable Pinot Noir. We also managed to find more of the 1998 Chambolle Musigny, Domaine Hudelot Noellat (\$26.99) which shows the silky tannins you expect from Chambolle Musigny, along with depth, finesse and freshness, and their 1998 Vosne Romanée (\$26.99), which has a medium ruby color, very fresh fruit and a pretty toasty note. It is surprisingly forward and ready to drink for the vintage, with hints of coffee and red fruits on the finish.

Meanwhile, some wonderful wines from a master of denser, riper Burgundies are in. Domaine Bertagna, owned by the Reh family from Germany, has continued to improve their wines. For the last 12 years, there has been a continual upward trend in their wines, as their vineyards are carefully managed and their vines mature. Temperature controlled fermentation and careful destemming keep the wines from being harsh, while they are dark, rich and toasty. The 1998 Nuits-St-Georges, "Les Meurgers", 1er Cru (\$58.99) has focused sweet fruit, with marionberry notes and a long finish. Even *The Wine Spectator* could not miss this one: "There's superbly integrated fresh acidity to the blackberry, floral and smoky notes; here is a winner. 90 points" The 1998 Vosne Romanée "Les Beaumonts", 1er Cru (\$59.99) shows a very rich, juicy, fairly forward style, wonderful elegance, and a long sweet finish. (Another 90 pointer from TWS). The 1998 Vougeot "Clos de la Perrière," 1er Cru (\$59.99) has succulent acidity, and is very rich, round, big wine, with toasty notes, lots of dark fruit, clove and spice on the nose, and lots of grip but fine tannins. —Keith Wollenberg

Customers and colleagues alike approach me on a regular basis to learn more about Italian wines, and the first thing that they ask me is "what book should I read?" Unfortunately, there is no easy answer. In Italy there have been regions that historically have produced very good wines and their best wines usually came from specific vineyard sites and or producers. Chianti—unlike Burgundy, the Mosel, Rhein or even Bordeaux—hasn't had every square meter documented, and named nor had legions of wine lovers traipsing through its vineyard rows. Chianti is almost 500 square miles of mysterious hills hidden in a mix of vegetation and historical haze. In these long forgotten, hidden valleys and precipitous slopes, though, new efforts are producing prodigious wines.

Making great wine is more about capital investment and sacrifice, and until 20 years ago, Italy was not a place where money was reinvested into vineyard and wineries. The famous name old-line wineries, such as Brolio, that have done this are now making fabulous wine. Areas in Chianti that have suffered capital neglect for centuries are actually some of the better wine sites, and new proprietors become impassioned producing wine true to its origins. Let me introduce you to **Colombaio di Cencio** (ko-lom-buy-oh dee chencho), a Chianti Classico producer from Gaiole who has emerged as a new star in the Tuscan sky. A 3 bicchieri winner in the *Gambero Rosso*, the **1997 Colombaio di Cencio "Futuro" (\$54.99)** is a Sangiovese and Cabernet Sauvignon blend, and everything modern, international winemaking is about—powerful, sexy, flashy, opulent wine that is very, very good. This wine brought the winery's name to our attention. For many wine lovers who have been drinking and

enjoying wines for years, and I run into them daily, the idea that Chianti can actually be considered good (let alone great) wine is a leap of faith too great for many. The Chianti you remember from your youth, lean, insipid and actually 30% white wine is not the Chianti Classico of today. It's not unlike the transformation of Italian food in this country where 20 years ago meatballs or veal Parmigiana were actually considered haute cuisine! The wine that really excites us is the **1997 Colombaio di Cencio Chianti Classico Riserva (\$32.99)**, in which layers of complexity unfold like chapters in a well-written book. The dynamic ripe cherry and plummy Sangiovese fruit from the 1997 vintage is like a tightly wound spring that gradually opens, slowly revealing its secrets. The use of new oak is subtle so that its textural benefits are felt but its flavor is not more than a gentle breeze on a warm day. Everything blended with the terroir unique to Gaiole where hints of lilac and violets blend delicately into spice, soil, freshly cut leather and the meaty richness of Porcini mushrooms. The wine begs for a pork loin roasted with rosemary and potatoes and a big decanter if you wish to drink it now. It is perfect that way, but the wine will age fantastically well and will show all of its potential from 2006-2012. I am going to buy some to drink over the near term and some to lay down for the long haul. I suggest you do both too. As I write this in early March we are days away from releasing the 1997 Barolo and 1998 Barbaresco pre-arrival offerings, by the time you get this in April we will be in full stride. We'll be updating our tasting notes from Vinitaly daily, your best way to keep abreast of what is available will be online at www.klwines.com —Greg St Clair
